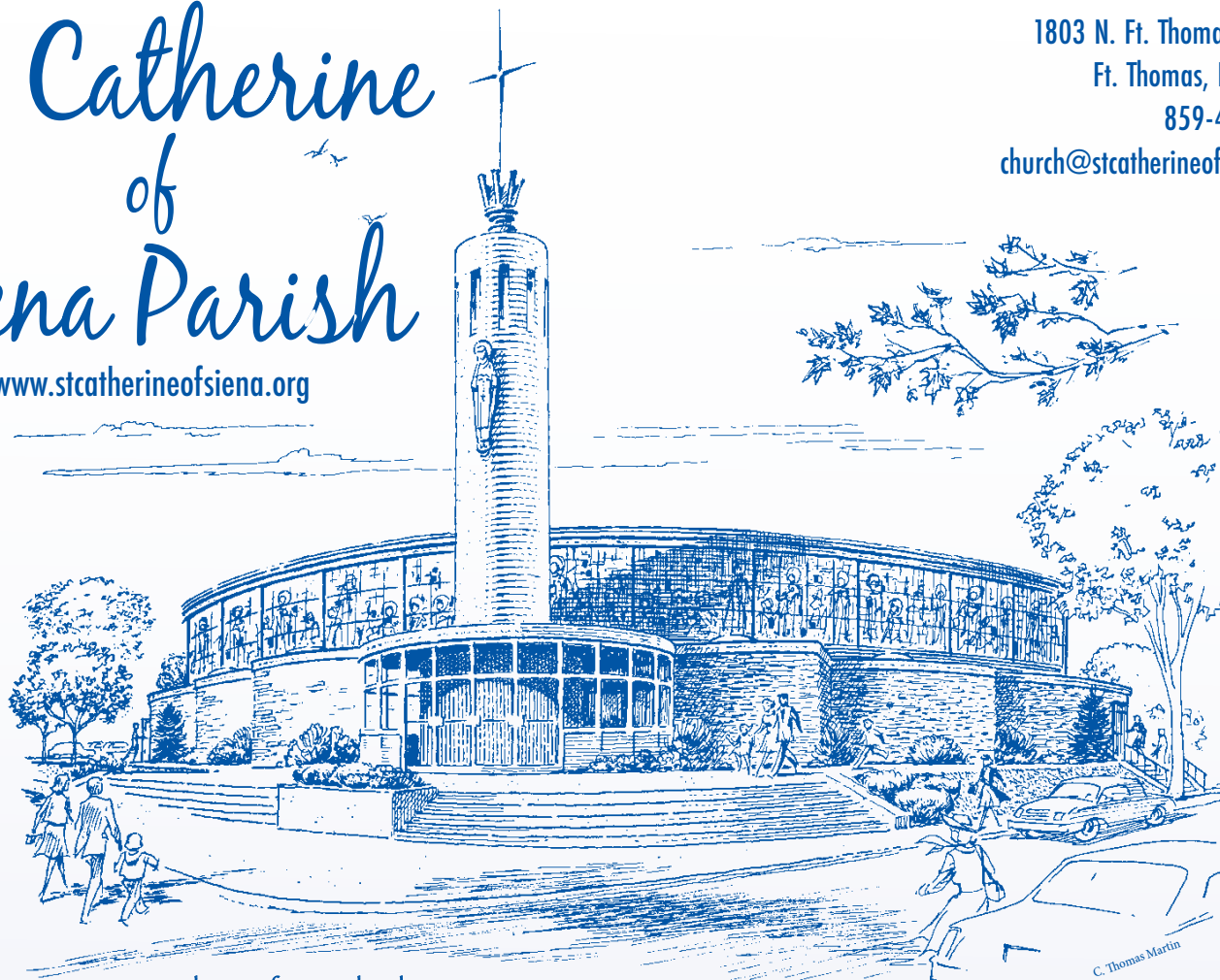

Baptism: Baptism is a joyful event "by which men and women are freed from their sins... are configured to Christ by an indelible character, and are incorporated into the Church." (Canon 849 of the Code of Canon Law). People can be baptized as adults or infants. The preparation for adult baptism takes place in the process of the catechumenate, commonly known as the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, or RCIA. Any adult desiring baptism may call the office to begin this process. Preparation for infant baptism happens in baptism classes, generally held on the fourth Thursday evening of each month in the Parish Office. No child will be baptized at St. Catherine unless both parents have attended one of these classes in the last five years. Baptism of adults generally takes place on Holy Saturday night, while baptism of infants can take place on any Sunday. Since baptism "incorporates one into the Church," it is appropriate that the infant be baptized during a Sunday liturgy when the local Church is gathered. There are legitimate reasons for not wanting to have the baptism during a Sunday liturgy; in those cases, baptisms may be scheduled for a Sunday at 1:00 p.m.

Parish Membership – Requires an Active Response

Active members of St. Catherine of Siena Parish have registered and provided the Parish Office with the information needed to complete the census forms. Active members regularly participate in the Saturday evening or Sunday Liturgy at St. Catherine of Siena Parish. Active members invest themselves in the parish by participating in the annual Stewardship Program pledging and contributing time, talent and treasure as God calls them. Active members hold the parish in their daily prayers.

IN OUR PARISH

Dear Parishioners,

We are getting ready for the Fall session of our small faith groups. If you are not in a group, I highly encourage you to join one or begin one. If you want to join one, but do not know a group to join, please call the parish office so we can help you get into one. If you would like to start a group, we can help you do that, also. If you want to talk about the groups, feel free to call me. Again this year, if you are in a larger group, you might consider splitting into smaller groups and inviting someone new to join. These groups seem to be of great benefit to people, both socially and spiritually.

The program I am suggesting for this next session (actually, depending on how you use it, it could last for two sessions) is "Eucharist: Discovering the Mass in the Bible," by Brant Pitre. I know the last video series I suggested was a disaster, and I apologize again for that. But Dr. Pitre's videos are much different. I have watched a few of them, and they are very good.

This program is on Formed, and can be accessed there. It is divided into 10 sessions, but each session has parts. So, for instance, the first session is in three parts, making it possible timewise for you to watch one part together, and still have time for discussion. (Actually, I would suggest you do just that: use each meeting to watch one part and discuss it. But, as usual, that is only a suggestion; you do what fits your group.) In addition to the group work, this program offers additional work between sessions for individual benefits.

The cost for the workbook for the session will be \$10.00. Payment can be dropped off at the parish office with checks payable to St. Catherine of Siena.

If you have any questions, feel free to call me, or talk to someone who has been in a group. Please get your orders in by Friday, September 1, so that we can get started by the middle of September.

LOOKING FOR GREETERS – Those of you who have been in the parish for more than a few years will remember that we used to have greeters at each of the church entrances for all three weekend Masses. We would like to try again to reinstate this ministry. The way it works is that you (either a single person, couple or a family) would volunteer to be a greeter at one of the weekend Masses and you would commit to this Mass the same week every month. For example, you would greet people at the 4:30 p.m. Mass the first Saturday of every month. (However, you are able to switch assignments or find a sub if you can't make your assigned Mass.) Typically, greeters will arrive about 20 minutes before Mass begins, simply stand outside one of the entrances, open the door and greet people as they arrive for Mass. At the end of Mass, you would go back to the same door and hand out bulletins and hold the door as people exit church. While it may sound like a small thing, it really makes a difference to those coming to Mass. WHO AM I?

Reflection on Matthew 16:13-20

Today's Gospel presents us with one of the central questions of our lives as Jesus asks: "Who do you say that I am?" There are so many answers that one can give: Lord, Savior, friend, teacher, Redeemer, confidant, brother, healer, Son of the Living God, Light of the World, the Christ. At one time or another in our lives, even in the course of any given day, one of these might surface as central in our relationship with Jesus.

Let us also consider that when addressing this question of Jesus' identity, we are also answering the question, "Who am I?" What do I believe? What do I stand for? Where is the North on my compass? What do I place at the center of my life?

When Peter confesses that Jesus is the Christ in answer to the question, Jesus then renames Peter, giving him a new identity and a new purpose. The same can happen to us, if we allow it. Jesus can re-name us, re-direct our passions, give us new understanding, renew in us clean hearts and the desire to follow Him wherever He might lead.

THE PASSION OF SAINT JOHN THE BAPTIST

Feast Day: August 29

Patron Saint of: builders and tailors

The drunken oath of a king with a shallow sense of honor, a seductive dance and the hateful heart of a queen combined to bring about the martyrdom of John the Baptist. The greatest of prophets suffered the fate of so many Old Testament prophets before him: rejection and martyrdom. The "voice crying in the desert" did not hesitate to accuse the guilty, did not hesitate to speak the truth. But why? What possesses a man that he would give up his very life?

This great religious reformer was sent by God to prepare the people for the Messiah. His vocation was one of selfless giving. The only power that he claimed was the Spirit of Yahweh. "I am baptizing you with water, for repentance, but the one who is coming after me is mightier than I. I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire" (Matthew 3:11).

Scripture tells us that many people followed John looking to him for hope, perhaps in anticipation of some great messianic power. John never allowed himself the false honor of receiving these people for his own glory. He knew his calling was one of preparation. When the time came, he led his disciples to Jesus: "The next day John was there again with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said, 'Behold, the Lamb of God.' The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus" (John 1:35-37).

It is John the Baptist who has pointed the way to Christ. John's life and death were a giving over of self for God and other people. His simple style of life was one of complete detachment from earthly possessions. His heart was centered on God and the call that he heard from the Spirit of God speaking to his heart. Confident of God's grace, he had the courage to speak words of condemnation, repentance, and salvation.
