Baptism: Baptism is a joyful event "by which men and women are freed from their sins... are configured to Christ by an indelible character, and are incorporated into the Church." (Canon 849 of the Code of Canon Law). People can be baptized as adults or infants. The preparation for adult baptism takes place in the process of the catechumenate, commonly known as the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, or RCIA. Any adult desiring baptism may call the office to begin this process. Preparation for infant baptism happens in baptism classes, generally held on the fourth Thursday evening of each month in the Parish Office. No child will be baptized at St. Catherine unless both parents have attended one of these classes in the last five years. Baptism of adults generally takes place on Holy Saturday night, while baptism of infants can take place on any Sunday. Since baptism "incorporates one into the Church," it is appropriate that the infant be baptized during a Sunday liturgy when the local Church is gathered. There are legitimate reasons for not wanting to have the baptism during a Sunday liturgy; in those cases, baptisms may be scheduled for a Sunday at 1:00 p.m.

Parish Membership – Requires an Active Response

Active members of St. Catherine of Siena Parish have registered and provided the Parish Office with the information needed to complete the census forms. Active members regularly participate in the Saturday evening or Sunday Liturgy at St. Catherine of Siena Parish. Active members invest themselves in the parish by participating in the annual Stewardship Program pledging and contributing time, talent and treasure as God calls them. Active members hold the parish in their daily prayers.

SHOW UP

Reflection on Matthew 22:1-14

A friend and colleague, who was chaplain at a university where I taught, announced in September that he would retire at the end of the academic year. He also announced that his motto for this, his last year of active ministry, would be simple: "Show up. Have fun."

As the parable unfolds, we are told that the invited guests refuse to show up, and so others ("..invite to the feast whomever you find") are bid to come. Showing up is important. In the context of God's Kingdom, showing up involves being deliberate and intentional about our discipleship: in worshipping, in service, in community-building, in loving God in all things and above all things. God asks us to show up every day, especially in a rhythm of daily prayer and Sunday Eucharist.

It is interesting that one poor bloke who showed up wasn't dressed properly, and so was thrown out of the feast. The proper "wedding garment" must be a symbol for something important. Perhaps it is the mind of Christ, or the heart of love, or the hands of service. At any rate, it is well to trust that the Bridegroom desires each of us to come to the feast!

SAINTS ISAAC JOGUES, JEAN DE BRÉBEUF, AND COMPANIONS

Feast Day: October 19 Patron Saint of: Norway, North America

Isaac Jogues and his companions were the first martyrs of the North American continent officially recognized by the Church. As a young Jesuit, Isaac Jogues, a man of learning and culture, taught literature in France. He gave up that career to work among the Huron Indians in the New World, and in 1636, he and his companions, under the leadership of Jean de Brébeuf, arrived in Quebec. The Hurons were constantly warred upon by the Iroquois, and in a few years Father Jogues was captured by the Iroquois and imprisoned for 13 months. His letters and journals tell how he and his companions were led from village to village, how they were beaten, tortured, and forced to watch as their Huron converts were mangled and killed.

An unexpected chance for escape came to Isaac Jogues through the Dutch, and he returned to France, bearing the marks of his sufferings. Welcomed home as a hero, Father Jogues might have sat back, thanked God for his safe return, and died peacefully in his homeland. But his zeal led him back once more to the fulfillment of his dreams. In a few months he sailed for his missions among the Hurons.

In 1646, he and Jean de Lalande, who had offered his services to the missioners, set out for Iroquois country in the belief that a recently signed peace treaty would be observed. They were captured by a Mohawk war party, and on October 18, Father Jogues was tomahawked and beheaded. Jean de Lalande was killed the next day at Ossernenon, a village near Albany, New York.

BIBLE STUDY WORKSHOP ON THE PROPHET JEREMIAH will be presented by Father Timothy P. Schehr, who is a retired biblical scholar and former professor at Mount St. Mary's School of Theology at the Athenaeum of Ohio. He has a B.A., M.Div. and an M.A. from the Athenaeum of Ohio. He also has a Ph.D. from Hebrew Union College. The workshop will take place on Saturday, October 28th from 9:00-11:30 a.m. We can think of Jeremiah as a potter prophet. When called to serve as a prophet, Jeremiah was entrusted with the word of God to build up the people, just as an artisan builds up a clump of clay on a potter's wheel. Let's read his book to discover how well the finished product turns out. Everyone is welcome to attend! The cost for the workshop is \$35.00.
