Baptism: Baptism is a joyful event "by which men and women are freed from their sins... are configured to Christ by an indelible character, and are incorporated into the Church." (Canon 849 of the Code of Canon Law). People can be baptized as adults or infants. The preparation for adult baptism takes place in the process of the catechumenate, commonly known as the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, or RCIA. Any adult desiring baptism may call the office to begin this process. Preparation for infant baptism happens in baptism classes, generally held on the fourth Thursday evening of each month in the Parish Office. No child will be baptized at St. Catherine unless both parents have attended one of these classes in the last five years. Baptism of adults generally takes place on Holy Saturday night, while baptism of infants can take place on any Sunday. Since baptism "incorporates one into the Church," it is appropriate that the infant be baptized during a Sunday liturgy when the local Church is gathered. There are legitimate reasons for not wanting to have the baptism during a Sunday liturgy; in those cases, baptisms may be scheduled for a Sunday at 1:00 p.m.

Parish Membership – Requires an Active Response

Active members of St. Catherine of Siena Parish have registered and provided the Parish Office with the information needed to complete the census forms. Active members regularly participate in the Saturday evening or Sunday Liturgy at St. Catherine of Siena Parish. Active members invest themselves in the parish by participating in the annual Stewardship Program pledging and contributing time, talent and treasure as God calls them. Active members hold the parish in their daily prayers.

IN OUR PARISH

Dear Parishioners,

I have decided to merge our two Sunday Masses into one Mass. Based on our present attendance, it is clear that we do not need two Masses, but the more important reason is the effect of our low attendance on what the diocese's With One Heart initiative calls our "Sunday Experience." For example, various people have mentioned the depressing effect seeing so many empty spaces in the pews has on their worship. I am hopeful that bringing everyone together in one Mass will alleviate that somewhat. On the other side of the coin, we have all experienced the energy that a full church of worshippers generates. I am hopeful here, also, that the strengthened singing and responding of all of us together will inspire all of us to greater participation and thereby to a better worshipping experience. Beginning the first Sunday of Advent, December 3, we will move to one Sunday Mass at 10:00 a.m. Why did I pick 10:00 a.m.? To be honest, a couple of people suggested 10:30, another 10:00, another 10:15; I soon realized that I would get as many people for one time as for another, so I just picked it. I was trying to split the difference between 9:00 and 11:30, and 10:00 sounded easier to remember than 10:15. Also, more people attend the 9:00 a.m. Mass than the 11:30 a.m. Mass; I take that to mean that more people would prefer an earlier time than a later - 10:00 a.m. as opposed to 10:30 a.m. We might be tempted to see this as a loss or a defeat. I prefer to think of this as a temporary situation that will keep a good worship experience as we work to revitalize the parish. I look forward to the day when we will need a second Mass again.

PARISH JESSE TREE PROJECT - Our annual Jesse Tree project begins this weekend. A traditional Jesse Tree depicts the genealogy of Jesus from the days of Jesse through specially-created ornaments hung from its branches. Our parish Jesse Tree expands upon the idea that the lineage of Jesse gave us Jesus, the greatest gift to mankind, by giving parishioners the opportunity to donate gifts to those in need in our community. We are called as Catholics to serve our neighbors in their spiritual and bodily necessities through the spiritual and corporal works of mercy. The purple ornaments list items needed by the agencies. The white ornaments on the tree are the spiritual needs of the organizations we serve and will help to realize the spiritual works of mercy. We are recommending that parishioners adopt these spiritual needs for the year. You may decide as a family to attend a weekday Mass, say a weekly Rosary or Novena, perform regular sacrifices, or include the intention in your family's regular prayer routine. The tree will be located in the church's prayer/ meditation space. Our hope is that all families will participate in this project. All gifts must be returned to the Jesse Tree area by Sunday, December 10th. Gifts will be picked up by the agencies on that Monday morning, so it's very important to drop off your gifts by the due date. Please do not wrap gifts.

THE LEAST OF THESE

Reflection on Matthew 25:31-46

As Catholics we have learned from infancy and know in our bones that God is present with us in a most powerful way in His Word, and most especially in the Eucharist. We hear, experience, and are nourished by this sacred presence at every Mass.

The surprise the Son of Man springs on all people assembled for this final separation and judgment ("whatever you did for one of the least brothers/ sisters of mine, you did for me"), connects in an inseparable manner God's Word and Eucharist with the needs of the poor. Every act of intentional reverence we give to the Word at Mass (standing, incensation, acclimation) and to the Eucharist (kneeling, praise, care of the elements), must be mirrored in our treatment of others, especially the poor, vulnerable, and those most in need. These are, in fact, one and the same deed.

At the very end of Matthew's Gospel, we hear the promise of Jesus to be with us always, to the end of time. Today, we learn that Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, fulfills that promise by being with us in the face of the poor, and that the King takes personally, as if done to Him, how we treat His subjects. Our action, or inaction, in response to those in need has eternal implications. ~ Fr. Jay

SAINT ANDREW

Feast Day: November 30 Patron Saint of: Fisherman

Andrew was Saint Peter's brother, and was called with him. "As [Jesus] was walking by the sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon who is now called Peter, and his brother Andrew, casting a net into the sea; they were fishermen. He said to them, 'Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.' At once they left their nets and followed him" (Matthew 4:18-20).

John the Evangelist presents Andrew as a disciple of John the Baptist. When Jesus walked by one day, John said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." Andrew and another disciple followed Jesus. "Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, 'What are you looking for?' They said to him, 'Rabbi (which translated means Teacher), where are you staying?' He said to them, 'Come, and you will see.' So they went and saw where he was staying, and they stayed with him that day" (John 1:38-39a).

Little else is said about Andrew in the Gospels. Before the multiplication of the loaves, it was Andrew who spoke up about the boy who had the barley loaves and fishes. When the Gentiles went to see Jesus, they came to Philip, but Philip then had recourse to Andrew.

Legend has it that Andrew preached the Good News in what is now modern Greece and Turkey and was crucified at Patras on an X-shaped cross.

As in the case of all the apostles except Peter and John, the Gospels give us little about the holiness of Andrew. He was an apostle. That is enough. He was called personally by Jesus to proclaim the Good News, to heal with Jesus' power and to share his life and death. Holiness today is no different. It is a gift that includes a call to be concerned about the Kingdom, an outgoing attitude that wants nothing more than to share the riches of Christ with all people.
