Baptism: Baptism is a joyful event “by which men and women are freed from their sins... are configured to Christ by an indelible character, and are incorporated into the Church.” (Canon 849 of the Code of Canon Law). People can be baptized as adults or infants. The preparation for adult baptism takes place in the process of the catechumenate, commonly known as the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, or RCIA. Any adult desiring baptism may call the office to begin this process. Preparation for infant baptism happens in baptism classes, generally held on the fourth Thursday evening of each month in the Parish Office. No child will be baptized at St. Catherine unless both parents have attended one of these classes in the last five years. Baptism of adults generally takes place on Holy Saturday night, while baptism of infants can take place on any Sunday. Since baptism “incorporates one into the Church,” it is appropriate that the infant be baptized during a Sunday liturgy when the local Church is gathered. There are legitimate reasons for not wanting to have the baptism during a Sunday liturgy; in those cases, baptisms may be scheduled for a Sunday at 1:00 p.m.

Parish Membership – Requires an Active Response

Active members of St. Catherine of Siena Parish have registered and provided the Parish Office with the information needed to complete the census forms. Active members regularly participate in the Saturday evening or Sunday Liturgy at St. Catherine of Siena Parish. Active members invest themselves in the parish by participating in the annual Stewardship Program pledging and contributing time, talent and treasure as God calls them. Active members hold the parish in their daily prayers.

One member of the couple must be a registered parishioner of St. Catherine Parish.

LOOKING FOR GREETERS: Those of you who have been in the parish for more than a few years will remember that we used to have greeters at each of the church entrances for all 3 weekend Masses. When we had our parish summit meeting over the summer, it was discussed that we start back up with this ministry, so that is what we are going to do. The way it works is that you (either a single person, couple or a family) would volunteer to be a greeter at one of the weekend Masses and you would commit to this Mass the same week every month. For example, you would greet people at the 4:30 Mass the first Saturday of every month. Typically, greeters will arrive about 20 minutes before Mass begins, simply stand outside one of the entrances and open the door and greet people as they arrive for Mass. At the end of Mass, you would go back to same door and hand out bulletins/hold the door as people exit church. While it may sound like a small thing, it really makes a difference to those coming to Mass. VOTE YES ON #2 YES FOR LIFE AMENDMENT: This November, Kentuckians will go to the polls once again. One of the choices facing them this year is a pro-life amendment to our State Constitution. Amendment #2 will explicitly affirm that the Kentucky Constitution contains no right to abortion or government funding of abortion. If this amendment is adopted, questions about abortion policy will be left in the hands of our elected representatives in the state legislature. It will prevent us from having a *Roe v. Wade*-type decision at the state level. There are many questions and misunderstandings about how this might affect women in difficult pregnancies with medical complications. The law currently recognizes a difference between medical treatment and elective abortion. And the legislature can, through the normal process, make any changes to the law that might be necessary in the future to fix anything that is unclear. Amendment #2 would do nothing to prevent or interfere with that process. It simply prevents the courts from declaring there is a constitutional right to abortion and striking down pro-life laws. The Kentucky Catholic Bishops are strongly encouraging all Kentuckians to go to the polls on election day this year, go to the end of their ballots and vote “YES” for Amendment #2.
